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N-400/N-600 CITIZENSHIP APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Permanent Resident Card/Green Card—front and back copy
 - Social Security Number
 - Passport/s – all passports for the last 5 years (i.e., from 2013) to document all trips taken outside of the U.S. for the last five years – indicate start/end dates (mm/dd/yyyy) and all countries travelled
 - Your residence/s for the last 5 years – complete address/es with dates (mm/dd/yyyy format) when you started and ended living in each address
 - Employment/Education history for the last 5 years – list each employer/school name, address, position, and start and end dates (mm/dd/yyyy format)
 - If you are married, provide your spouse's:
 - Name, birthdate, date of marriage, address
 - Immigration status - include A# if permanent resident or naturalized citizen, date/place of naturalization
 - Information on spouse's previous marriage/s (provide information on all prior spouses):
 - Name of prior spouse, immigration status of prior spouse, date of marriage, date of end of marriage, reason for end of marriage (death, divorce, etc.)
 - If you were previously married, indicate the number of marriages and provide the following information for each of your prior spouse/s:
 - Name, date of marriage, date of end of marriage, reason for end of marriage, address
 - Immigration status - include A# if permanent resident or naturalized citizen, date/place of naturalization
 - Information regarding your parents if any one of them is a US Citizen:
 - Name, birthdate, birthplace, A#, date of naturalization
 - Information for all children (including biological, adopted, stepchildren, etc.)
 - Child's name, birthdate, country of birth, current home address, and relationship to you (biological child, adopted, stepchild, etc.)
 - Child's immigration status – include A# if permanent resident or naturalized citizen
 - Information on any arrests, citations, charges, detention, jail, convictions, imprisonment, sentence, etc. – THIS INCLUDES ALL MOVING TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS
 - Date/s and place/s of arrest, citation or charge
 - Police and court records re arrests, charges, convictions, and penalties (fine, jail, probation, etc.)
 - Information on any exclusions, removals or deportations from the U.S.:
 - Date/s and place/s of exclusion, removal or deportation proceedings
 - Selective Service number and registration date if you are a male who lived in the U.S. between ages 18-26 (information available at www.sss.gov)
- NOTE: YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR A FEE WAIVER**
- In certain circumstances, USCIS approves fee waivers for qualified individuals. The following information/documents are needed so that we may assess your eligibility:
- Most recent tax return forms with all W2s, attachments and schedules
 - Any government benefits received (e.g., food stamps, Medi-Cal, etc.)
 - Obtain a verification of benefits letter for each benefit received; the letter must show the name of the person receiving the benefit, the name of the government agency providing the benefit, amount of benefit received, and if the benefit is still being actively received

FASGI requests a \$130 donation for each application processed. This includes processing of your application and legal review of your documents prior to submission. The legal review is conducted by an attorney or a Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA) accredited person. At the legal review, you will be given instructions on filing your application (we do not file the application for you). You will also be given review materials for the civics test, which is a part of your formal USCIS interview.
